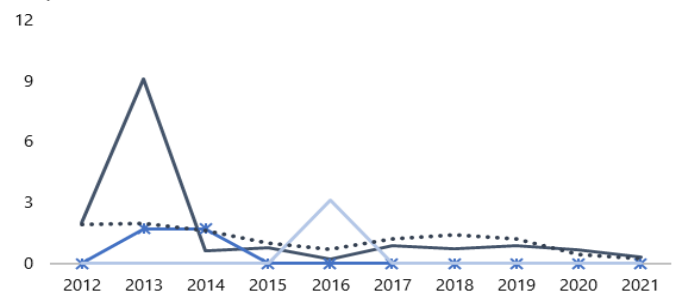

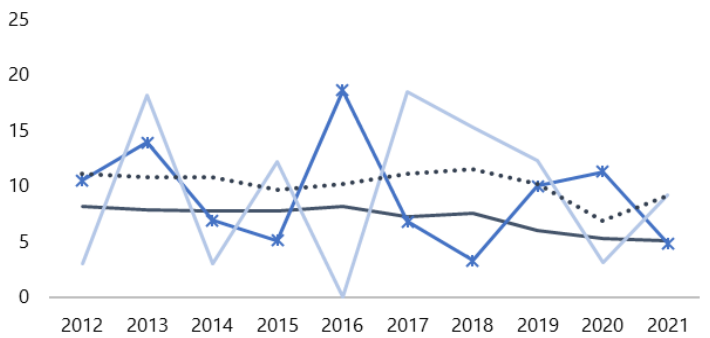

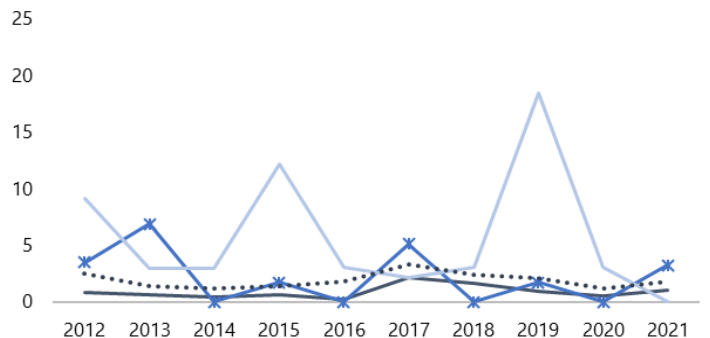

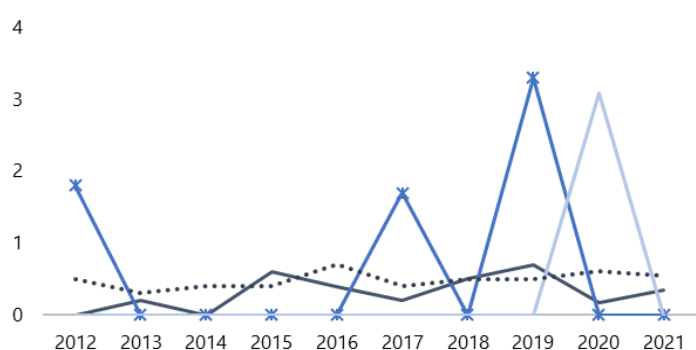

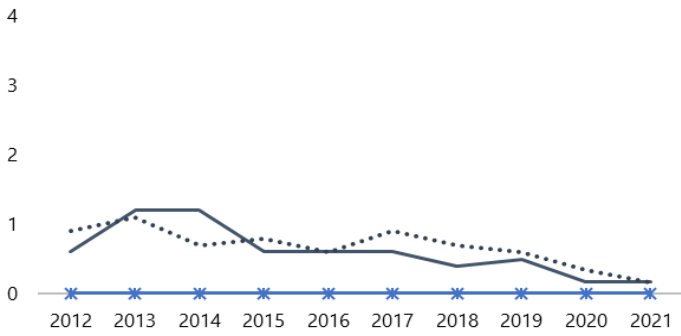
Listeriosis - perinatal



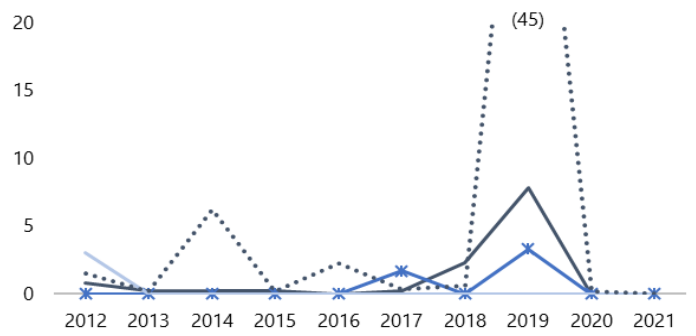
